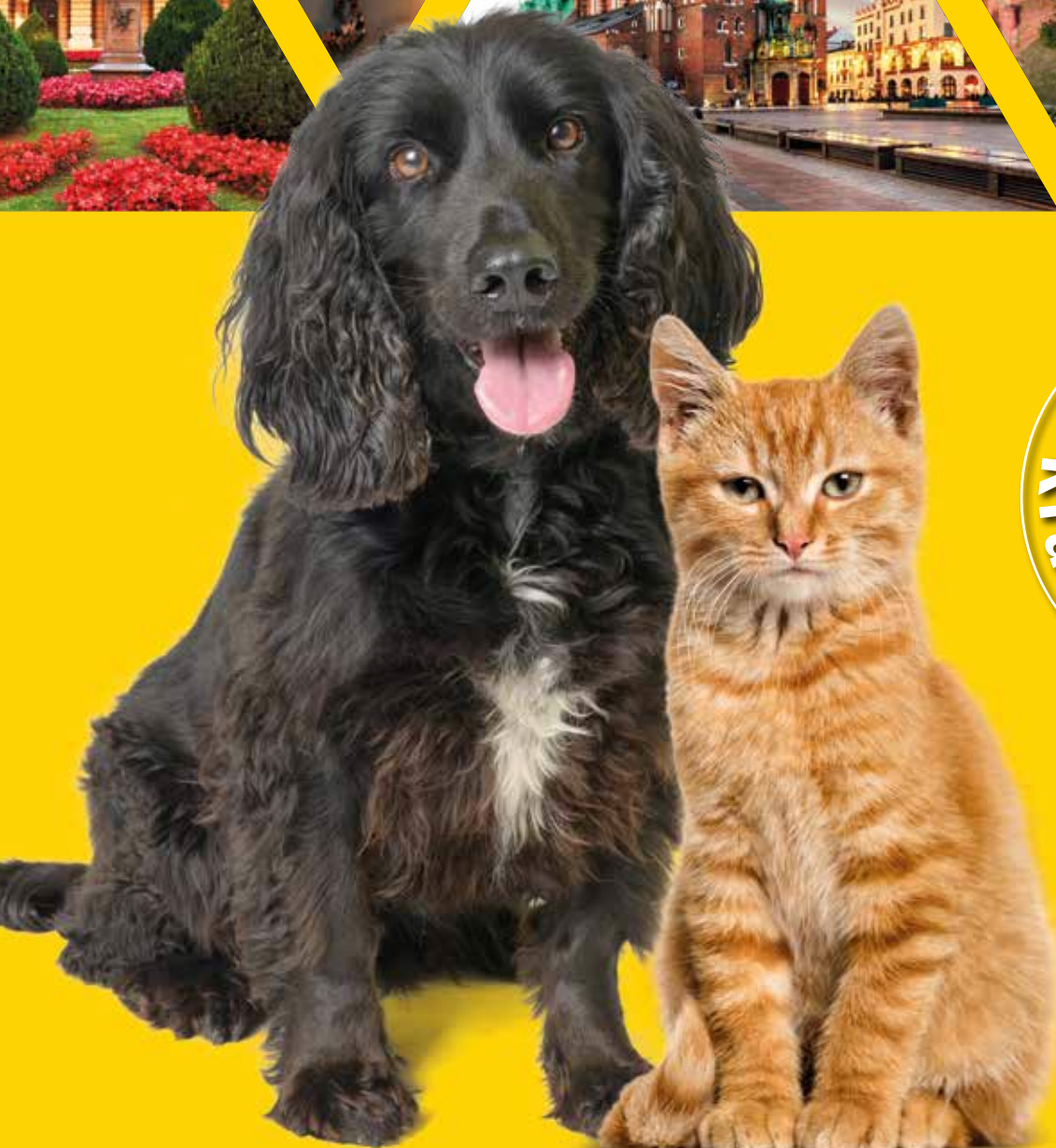
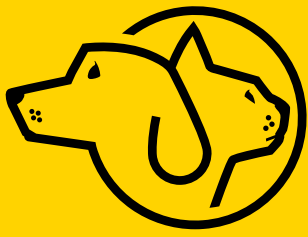

The tour of the Old Town begins with a brief visit to the old Jewish district of Kazimierz. The group will then stroll to Wawel Hill, over which towers the Royal Palace with its impressive arcaded Renaissance courtyard and the famous Gothic cathedral. The group will then visit the oldest university college – the Collegium Maius, and finish the tour in the heart of Krakow at the Main Market Square; the largest medieval square in Europe.
